Compost Program Expands

This month marks an important change in the way we manage our waste in Vancouver. Starting this month single-family houses no longer have to send *raw food waste* to the landfill.

Instead we have two options for this waste: compost it in our backyard (as some of us have been doing for years) or put it out in the Green Top Bin for the City to take away with our yard trimmings.

This is really good news. Food rotting in landfills produces an aggressive greenhouse gas called methane. By keeping our food out of the landfill we reduce methane and slow down climate change.

We've learned a lot about garbage in the past 20 years and we are slowly changing our daily practices to reduce waste and its harmful impacts.

If you are ready to try backyard composting, we have several events planned during Salmonberry Days to get you off on the right foot – including \$25 dollar starter bins for sale at the Salmonberry Days market on May 30. If you choose to use your Green Bin instead, we can help you get started with that and answer your questions.

SATURDAY, MAY 1**JANE'S WALK****A walk into Vancouver's Agricultural past - and future!****10:00am – noon**

Terry Slack will help us see vanished landmarks from the past: a creek-driven grist mill, river barns, hand-dug ditches and fertile pastureland and fields that supplied meat and dairy products to the new city of "Granville" around the far side of Point Grey a hundred years ago, and Chinese market gardens that were an important source of fresh produce from the 1920s to the 1950s. The walk will finish with a visit to "Southlands Heritage Farm" at 51st and Balaclava, where small-scale urban agriculture is making a comeback.

Wheelchair-friendly, families welcome, bring water and snacks, no dogs please (horses and wildlife in Southlands). Bus routes on 41st and 49th stop at Blenheim. The new bike route on Balaclava runs to Celtic Avenue and the Riverfront Trail.

Rejuvenating old fruit trees, year two!**Noon – 2:00pm**

Gary Adams is back to check up on the fruit trees we pruned last year in the old field at Maynards' Southlands Heritage Farm. He'll show us what cuts to make this year. Bring a hand pruner (ideally in a holster), a pruning saw and a lopper. If you are going on Terry Slack's walk before this session, you can drop off your tools at 51st & Balaclava. Be sure to label them with your name.

Geology of Point Grey/Burrard Inlet**2:00 – 4:00pm**

David Cook will lead a walk between Kitsilano and Jericho beaches to see the rocks and land features of Burrard Inlet. We will see plant fossils in coal seams and sandstones making up a 50-million year old river delta and how the unceasing action of the waves is slowly eating away the beach frontage. Looking around Burrard Inlet, we will observe rocks and land forms that were created over the last 100 million years by plate tectonics, sea-level changes and ice movement.
