## Celebration of Resilience

Hasn't this been a season of upheaval all over the world?

The familiar order of people's daily lives is being disrupted by events beyond anyone's control or imagination: earthquakes, political uprisings, blizzards, floods, droughts... Every day brings a new story.

Even here in Vancouver we are feeling subtle shock-waves. Disruptions in distant parts of the world have triggered sharp rises in prices at our grocery stores and gas pumps.

And all the while, we wait for the earthquake and tsunami that are predicted for this region!

The key lesson from Japan, we are told, is *preparedness*. The Japanese people have been practicing for a major earthquake ever since the Kobe quake in 1995. Their preparations have reduced the physical damage and the psychological stress during the recent disaster and during the long period of reconstruction to come.

This year's Salmonberry Days is a celebration of resilience – the resilience of natural systems as well as the resilience of human communities that work well together to solve problems and build a better life for their children in good times and in bad.

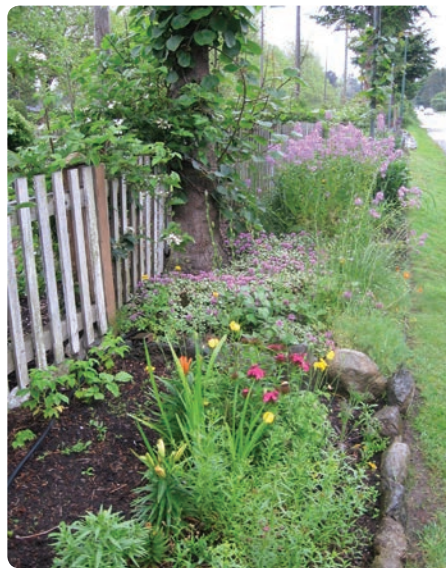
