**Jericho Beach/Kitsilano Beach geological history and intertidal biology**

**An interpretive walk with David Cook**

**Meet at noon -- duration 2 to 3 hours**

**Meeting place: Jericho Beach Park parking lot (east side of Jericho Beach Park). This area is at the far west end of Point Grey Road.**

We will look at the glacial erratic in Jericho Beach Park and the wetland constructed from the former estuary of Jerry's Cove. Because the tide will be low we will walk east along the beach and discuss the ecology and function of the intertidal zone; the interface between the marine and terrestrial ecosystems. You will see how species cope with the extreme changes to their environment as the tides ebb and flow twice every day. We will also

note the geology of the rocks on which the intertidal life makes its home and the changes to their habitat that have occurred since the ice left the area 12000 years ago.

Wear appropriate non-slip footwear as there will be wet, slippery and muddy patches.

The majority of Pacific Spirit Regional Park was logged exhaustively in the 1890's. The slopes above Wreck Beach are relatively intact old-growth forest. At our meeting point we will have a view of one of North America's largest grand firs. We will then hike along the thickly forested Old Marine Drive identifying and describing species and the ecology of the various native plants that we will see.

This site became known as "Topside" and was eventually purchased by the school and a new Senior School opened in 1965. The "new" school was designed by Mark Sharp and featured low lines, a central courtyard and the use of local wood. If you have ever been interested in seeing the inside of the school, please join Neil Piller, Director of Operations and alumni for a tour.
