

The Oxford Dictionary defines Resilience as "the capacity to withstand or recover quickly from difficulties". Five years ago Dunbar faced the shutdown of many stores, the library and community centre with the arrival of the COVID pandemic. The only reminder today is seasonal vaccinations. When a disastrous fire and crane collapse happened on 41st Avenue neighbours helped each other and the firemen to spray water on roofs of nearby houses. A February snowfall found residents shovelling sidewalks and steps of adjacent properties. An earth tremor made us aware of the need for emergency preparedness. The Dunbar Earthquake and Emergency Preparedness group (DEEP) holds information sessions to help inform residents about preparedness – and keeps a disaster support hub ready in containers in Memorial Park West (As seen pictured above). As the Dunbar neighbourhood densifies we will need resilience to deal with the changes that take place.

Ecology of a Temperate Forest impacted by logging, agriculture and introduced plants.

On this beautiful forest walk we will see how a native temperate forest impacted by man is recovering. Plant species will be identified. We will look at the work done in restoration of Spanish Creek, one of four "lost" streams of Vancouver brought back to life for salmon spawning. Planting & remediation at the mouth of Spanish Creek has been done to keep the waters cool & shaded to attract salmon.

## Fire! Walk with John Atkin 7 to 8:30 pm

# Meet at the corner of Camosun St and West 19th Ave

A walking tour with a difference. On this Salmonberry Days walk we'll be exploring the history of fires. From the early days of logging activity in today's Pacific Spirit Park there have been fires with the largest being the 1919 blaze which burned over 500 acres. We will be walking in Pacific Spirit Park to take a look at the surviving stumps which still bear the scorch marks of this historic blaze.

Beware that we are on trails not streets, so wear comfortable shoes and be prepared for a couple of flights of stairs from the Camosun Boardwalk up to the forest level.

#### **SATURDAY MAY 31**

Low Tide Walk
David Cook Geologist / Biologist
9 am – 3 to 4 hours walk.
Wear appropriate non-slip footwear. The route will be rocky, damp and slippery with many puddles left by the retreating

Geology of the Vancouver area as seen along Kitsilano Beach & Jericho Beach Park.

Meet at Jericho Beach parking lot, the west end of Point Grey Road, which is a cul-de-sac.

We will beach-walk east at low tide from Jericho Beach Park looking at geological forms. We will see giant boulders left by retreating glaciers, 50-million year old coal deposits, old volcano forms and ancient plant fossils. The land around us has been created over the last 100 million years, and unceasing wave action is slowly eating away the beach frontage.
